### We're Challenging YOU...

...to read! That's right! Our annual Summer Reading Challenge is kicking off on Saturday, June 7, encouraging everyone of every age in Ferndale to sign up for the chance to win prizes. Participating is easy--we'll show you how to get started!

**Color Our World:** The theme of our 2025 Summer Reading Program is "Color Our World!" We're inviting participants of all ages to embark on a journey of art and creativity, celebrating the myriad ways in which the arts enrich our every day lives!

We, of course, love to embrace a theme, but that won't mean you're required to specifically read books about, ya know, chromatics or the history of Pantone...But we will have events and art exhibitions that certainly celebrate a colorful view of the world, so stay tuned for that!

**Summer Reading--How to Participate:** We can answer all of your questions about Summer Reading at our special Kickoff Event, happening on June 7, where staff can also show you how to sign up as an individual, or, how parents/caregivers can sign up their family! But, since you're here, reading this lil' newsletter, we'll provide you with the basics:

We'll have unique challenges for four age groups, including: ● Early Readers (ages 0-4) ● Kids, (ages 5-12) ● Teens (ages 13-18) ● Adults (18+). Everyone has until August 2nd to complete their challenge!

**Keep (on Track):** The goal is to log your reading and activities over the summer, earning rewards along the way. We'll show you how to download and use the Beanstack mobile app, where you can complete a

set amount of activities arranged on a digital bingo square. Participants have the chance to win fun prizes based on how many bingo squares they complete along the way! Each age group's Summer "Reading" bingo sheet will look a little different, but the point is you don't have to just "read" in order to complete the challenge! Beanstack is available in your app store, or you can access it via desktop from our website at **fadl.org/summer**.

Also, the library can provide printed-out paper logs for anyone who prefers a more analog-styled approach to Summer Reading--just ask us at the Kickoff or check-in at any of our service desks for more information!

Come to the Kickoff: Think of it as a sign-up-celebration... Summer Reading festivities will essentially take over the entire library on Saturday, June 7 between 12 pm - 4 pm, with special activities scheduled between 1 pm - 3 pm. Outside in the library's courtyard, we'll have jumbo lawn games like Putt-Putt and Jenga, provided by Oakland County Parks' RAPP Program, plus, there will be the Treat Dreams Dream Machine serving, among other options, a library-themed ice cream flavor!

Indoors, we'll have face-painting, temporary tattoos, and crafts in our program room. You can drop-in anytime during the afternoon to sign up, but we encourage individuals and families to stick around to enjoy all of our featured festivities!

**Upcoming events:** Embracing the artful theme of "Color Our World," we'll have artsy/craftsy programs like cupcake decorating for teens, pottery tile-making for kids/tweens, and a visit from a Michigan-based children's book author. For adults, we'll have craft nights featuring DIY fairy houses, neurographic art, and

more. We also have a special student art show with works by Ferndale Public School students on display throughout the month of June!

## New Organizational System for Youth Nonfiction Nearly three years ago, our Youth Librarians started out on what became guite a journal of reorganizing the entire pen fiction section.

Nearly three years ago, our Youth Librarians started out on what became quite a journey: relabeling and reorganizing the entire non-fiction section of the Kids Corner! Inspired by several other libraries around the nation, the decision was made to "ditch Dewey," i.e., the Dewey Decimal System, and begin work on reorganizing the way Youth Nonfiction items would be organized--primarily moving away from the a numbers-based system to a words-based system.





The Ferndale-METIS System is designed to make it easier for kids to find what they're looking for. Within the alphabetical structure, we've put kids' nonfiction items into categories, like *Animals and Prehistory*, then organized the items within those categories.

Rather than numbers and decimal points, books have accessible labels containing words and images that specifies the subject matter of each nonfiction item. FADL Youth Librarians started this project in 2023, inspired by the PA.-based Miquon School Library's Metis system.







Overall, this project required Youth Librarians to reorganize the entire section--first through extensive spreadsheets, then diligently designing for accessibility, and finally through physical relabeling and shifting of more than 7,000 items: books, DVDs & more!

Now, with Ferndale-METIS, there are 26 categories that use the letters of the alphabet. Each category is divided into subcategories, which are also divided alphabetically. Spine labels on each item show three visual elements that identify: category->sub category->subject.

For the second year in a row, we'll be graced with our very own library-themed ice cream flavor, available for a limited time (and also on tap, so to speak, for our Kickoff event on June 7!); "The Hungry Catepillar" is a delicious vegan and gluten-free key-lime ice cream with rainbow sprinkles and a strawberry swirl.

Ferndale Project, meanwhile, is the experimental arm of Eastern Market Brewing, and we've been able to collaborate with the talented brewmasters there on library-themed IPA's, typically on tap during Library Card Sign-Up Month (i.e. September). In fact, we're entering our fourth consecutive year of hosting a Book Club at Ferndale Project, tending to focus on literary fiction, thrillers, and (occasionally) memoirs.

Speaking of Book Clubs, we have one dedicated specifically to Graphic Novel titles hosted inside Drifter Coffee! The owners of Drifter allow our book club members to hang out inside the coffee shop after hours, while still being able to enjoy beverages from the coffee bar!

But we don't just host book clubs, we also have an Album Club that meets at the W.A.B. (Woodward Avenue Brewers), and we also had the opportunity to bring our Film Club events into the Loving Touch, where we hosted screenings of cult classics like The Crow!

Of course, our longest ongoing partner is none other than the **Friends of the Ferndale Library**, a nonprofit, volunteer-run group that's dedicated to supporting the ongoing production of exciting library programming, like our Summer Concert Series, and our weekly Podcast, "A Little Too Quiet!" You can stop in to visit the Friends Used Bookstore, where you'll also find t-shirts, as well as custom library enamel pins and scented candles by local crafter The Brave Wimp!
